Numeracy

All pupils will continue with their numeracy learning from home. Pupils will have a learning activity linked to a different domain of numeracy each day. Teacher videos will also accompany activities to explain learning.

Each class will also have a maths topic which will be able to be covered using resources available in the home, if required. There will be a minimum of one maths learning activity per week.

IDL/Topic

All classes will have a class topic to be learning about at home. Teachers will have prepared lessons and there will also be opportunities for families to tie this in to being outdoors and what we are doing at home. Each class will share their topic at the beginning of any school closure so that families are aware of the theme for learning.

PE and Health and Wellbeing

Mr Cook will plan a weekly PE lesson for each class within the school. There will also be links to additional fitness activities and resources that families can engage with should they wish.

Each class will also support pupil health and wellbeing by making sure activities are shared and there are opportunities to check in with pupils virtually and through commenting on learning regularly.

If you need any support with home learning then please contact your child's class teacher in the first instance. They will be more than happy to help.



What will learning look like?

<u>Literacy</u>

<u>RWI</u>

RWI will continue to be delivered to different groups of learners from home. Your child will have their book read to them digitally and they will be able to practise reading the book and completing associated literacy tasks. These will be set daily by teachers.

Skills Based Reading

Pupils in our P4-P7 classes who follow a skills based reading skills programme will continue to have this approach delivered at home by the class teacher. Resources will be available to support and activities will be set.
